Imagine a world where everyone is assumed to be Lesbian or Gay. All your friends and family are Gay or Lesbian. All children are born through artificial insemination. All other ways are seen as dirty or wrong. If students do something foolish, weak or embarrassing at school everyone calls them Hetero. Young people who think they might be hetero often feel isolated and depressed. Many attempt suicide. Things are slowly getting better. Not all the Heterosexual people on the television are figures of fun or shown as depraved and diseased. Recently Hetero people have even been allowed the same civil rights as Gay and Lesbian couples. Imagine what it would feel like to live in this world.

Peer Productions have been working with young people who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgendered or who are questioning their sexuality, to devise this innovative production and workshop. The production is designed to support schools PSHE Sex and Relationships work. Full INSET teacher training is provided supported by Schools Out for this production and is included in the £500 price (to book just the play costs £250 but training is recommended).
